# CAMP DIRECTOR

Summer is here (and almost half way over!). This is the time of year that we spend so much time planning, preparing for, and praying about. This is the time of year where we see the full potential of camp ministry on full display, and we are excited to see the unique ways that God accomplishes his saving work in the midst of the fun, adventure, and craziness of summer camp.

In the month of June, we hosted three camps - the largest being Middle School Camp which 86 campers grades 5-8 attended. It was a crazy week of weather during this camp with a total of 7 inches of rain falling while camp was in session. Lakes appeared at camp that are not normally present, and the Blue Earth River flooded its banks, totally submerging two of our paintball courses. Mud was a constant friend during this camp, and dry shoes were a rarity. But despite the challenges, it was an awesome week of camp. Our program team did an excelled job of adjusting programming due to the weather and did a fantastic job of keeping an upbeat and exciting atmosphere. The new dining hall building was a great blessing in all the wet weather. The completed lower level was used as a game room and large indoor space for campers to escape the wet weather. Most importantly, powerful ministry took place, with 25 students indicating that they placed their faith and trust in Jesus Christ as their savior for the first time. Below is one example of the ministry that took place as shared by one of our cabin leaders:

"I had a girl who was pretty quiet through most of the cabin times. She just didn't want to open up and share anything. I felt like she wasn't really getting much in the spiritual aspect. On the last night, during the time when the kids when off and prayed on their own, she came up to me and asked how she could accept Jesus into her life. This was so exciting as I realized she wasn't just being quiet, but instead had been thinking and observing all along."

A busy summer is still ahead as we have two more programmed camps, and are hosting multiple retreats and guest groups! We are especially excited about our upcoming High School Camp! We are expecting between 50 to 60 students and are looking forward to adventuring with them all over southern Minnesota. Please pray for safety, positive and growing relationships, and the truth of the gospel to change lives.

### Ways to FUND THE MISSION

Below is a list of ways that others have helped and may be a good fit for you. It is because of your prayers and support that we have been able to reach young people in the Albert Lea area.



Become a Team PRC Member by making a three-year <u>monthly</u> pledge of \$25, \$100, \$500 or different amount, or making a three-year <u>annual</u> pledge of \$1,000, \$10,000, \$25,000 or a different amount.



The value of real estate can often greatly increase the size of your estate. A real estate donation entitles you to a significant current tax deduction and can reduce the value of your estate, which can save or eliminate estate taxes. It can also provide a lifetime



Donating appreciated stocks or mutual funds can be a great benefit to both the donor and Prairie River Camp. As a donor of an appreciated stock or mutual fund, you are able to avoid paying capital gains tax on the appreciation of the asset. Also, as the donor of that security, you get to deduct the full fair market value of the security at the time of the gift, if you have held the security for longer than 12 months.



A bequest through a will or trust is the most popular form of planned giving. By remembering Prairie River Camp in a will or trust, you are looking past your own lifetime to further the work of the kingdom through the

Prairie River Camp Endowment Fund. These gifts ensure that Prairie River Camp will always be ready to reach out to young people.



You make an irrevocable gift, generally using cash, maturing CD's, or securities in exchange for lifetime guaranteed payments, the amount of which is based on the value of your gift and the age(s) of the payment recipients. In addition, the donor receives an immediate income tax deduction, and a portion of each payment is income tax free!
